

The Glenfir School History Adventure May 23-25

Fits the curriculum for students in grades 5 and 9.

An extra-curricular opportunity to enrich the topics we have covered this year.

Students will visit Fort Langley, a Hudson's Bay Company post and will learn about the fur trade and settlement of British Columbia. Students will also take part in a voyageur canoeing activity on the Fraser River. Our accommodation on Friday and Saturday night will be camping out in teepees!

In the afternoon, students will learn about Aboriginal culture through stories, games, and other hands-on activities. They will be treated to a feast including roast buffalo, corn, squash, and other traditional foods. In the morning, after the sun-rise ceremony, students will have another traditional meal before returning to the Okanagan on Sunday.



Other Details and Cost Breakdown

The estimated cost will be approximately \$250 per person. The Glenfir School will pay 50% for all students in grades 5 and 9. (\$175-\$185 of the cost is for the teepees and meals.)
