How to Review:

- Label the items on the world map provided
- Study the map of Africa
- Review how websites are evaluated
- Review assignments from Operation Africa
- Study notes on aid organizations
- Create flashcards for keywords and terms
- Review how geography and environment influence settlement patterns
- Review how technology promotes global communication
- Review the Declaration of Rights of the Child
- Review your action plan from Operation Africa so that you are able to provide details about how and why it would work
- Review Canada's primary economic partnerships (this is a focus for some lessons) in May)
- Review what a Canadian is (will be a focus in May to tie together activities from the entire year)

Scoring:

- Mapping will be marked for accuracy. Correct spelling will be provided on the test so mistakes made in spelling will be penalized.
- There will be twenty multiple choice questions worth .5 marks each. Marks will be recorded for each correct answer.
- Short answer questions are worth two marks each. Students are expected to write at least five sentences in each short answer question. This will be modeled in class.
- The essay will be worth ten marks. It will be graded based on content, organization, and mechanics. Students will practice writing essay responses in class prior to the exam.
