Concepts to be Covered:

Physiographic regions of Canada

Ethnography Keywords

English Civil War (in relation to the development of the notion of democracy)

Settlement of North America (colonialism, French and English conflicts)

Mercantilism (fur trade)

American Revolution (intolerable acts, Loyalists, taxation without representation)

Government policies (Royal Proclamation, Quebec Act, Constitutional Act)

Development of Representative Governments (House of Burgesses, system in Canada after 1791)

How to Review:

- Review old notes
- Review jeopardy files
- Create webs for the concepts mentioned above
- Review summaries in the text books
- Be able to explain the changes to the map shown in the inside cover of the text book
- Create illustrations to show the system of representative government

Scoring: (subject to change)

- There will be thirty multiple choice questions worth 1 mark each. Marks will be recorded for each correct answer.

- Short answer questions are worth two marks each. Students are expected to write at least five sentences in each short answer question. This will be modeled in class.

- The essay will be worth ten marks. It will be graded based on content, organization, and mechanics. Students will practice writing essay responses in class prior to the exam.
